Search the NHS
Knowledge & Library Hub



The NHS Knowledge and Library Hub is a discovery system which connects NHS staff and learners seamlessly to a range of high quality knowledge and evidence resources all in one place.

It offers an intuitive search experience for quick searches and options for in-depth searches. It includes:

- Over 7,000 journals
- Books and e-publications, including the Oxford University Handbooks.
- One-click access to the full-text where available, to request a copy, or to contact the library.
- Links to clinical decision support tools such as BMJ Best Practice and UpToDate.
- NICE pathways and guidelines.
- Databases like Medline, EMBASE and Cinahl.

Login with your NHS Athens account for full-text access to all the resources!



Open the NHS Knowledge & Library Hub.


Click the yellow bar at the top of the page and login with your <u>NHS Athens</u> username and password.



Enter your search terms in the box and click the 'Search' button.




The search results page will open, showing your results in the middle column. Some topics will have a 'Research Starter' at the top, giving an overview of the topic. Click to open.



Use the limits on the left side menu to limit your results, for example, by date range, language, etc.

The buttons on the right allow you to run the search in other resources.



Articles not available online you can request using the 'Request this item' button—enter your name and email into the pre-populated form.
